OUR REDEEMER PRACTICES CLOSED COMMUNION



The Sacrament of the Altar is the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine for us Christians to eat and drink, instituted by Christ Himself. As we receive this Sacrament, the oneness of fellowship at the Altar (I Corinthians 10:17) presupposes a oneness in doctrine with the Apostles (Acts 2:42). For this reason the congregations of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod have agreed to follow the Biblical and historical practice of Closed Communion. If you desire to receive the Lord's Supper and are not a communicant member of Our Redeemer or a sister congregation in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, we respectfully ask that you not commune this morning. Rather, we would invite you to speak with Pastor Knox,

Pastor Saunders, or Vicar Baker about Holy Communion and about becoming a communicant member of this congregation.

TODAY THE CHURCH OBSERVES THE FESTIVAL OF THE BAPTISM OF OUR

LORD. This always occurs on the First Sunday after the Epiphany of our Lord.

Today is a day for each Christian to rejoice and take comfort in the Baptism of Jesus, for it points them to the Baptism which they have received into Jesus. Just as Jesus is revealed as the Son of God by the voice of the Father which declares, "You are my beloved Son", so have you received this same promise. When you were Baptized in the name of the Holy Trinity, you were born again and given the privilege to be called sons of God and heirs of God's everlasting kingdom.

Similarly, as the Father declared of His Son, "with You I am well pleased," so has God declared His pleasure with you. There is a difference though! The Father's pleasure with Jesus is found

in His Son's obedience. The Father's pleasure with you is found, not in your obedience, but in Jesus' obedience, including His sacrificial death, on your behalf.

As you contemplate this gracious miracle, perhaps you are led to ask the question, "How can Baptism accomplish this?" Fortunately, you already have the answer to that question in the Small Catechism:

How can water do such great things?

It is not the water indeed that does them, but the word of God, which is in and with the water, and faith, which trust such word of God in the water. For without the word of God the water is simple water and no Baptism. But with the word of God it is a Baptism, that is, a gracious water of life and a washing of regeneration in the Holy Ghost, as St. Paul says, Titus chapter third: [According to His mercy He saved us] By the washing of regeneration and renewing of the Holy Ghost, which He shed on us abundantly through Jesus Christ, our Savior, that, being justified by His grace, we should be made heirs according to the hope of eternal life. This is a faithful saying."

I. THE PREPARATION

Remain Seated

The Liturgy of Baptismal Remembrance

- P: In the name of the Father, and of the (♣) Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen
- P: In Holy Baptism you have been forgiven your sins and granted a new life in Christ, our Lord. You solemnly renounced the devil, all his works and ways, and all his empty promises. In this gracious water of life and washing of regeneration in the Holy Spirit, the Church confesses the gift of faith in God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. On this day, as you recall the Baptism of Our Lord and also your own Baptism, I ask you to confess anew what God has done for you in Holy Baptism.
- P: Do you renounce the devil?
- C: I do renounce him.
- P: Do you renounce all his works and ways?
- C. I do renounce them.
- P: Do you renounce all his empty promises?
- C: I do renounce them.
- P: Do you believe in God the Father Almighty?
- C: Yes, I believe in God the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.
- P: Do you believe in Jesus Christ?
- C: Yes, I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary; suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; The third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.
- P: Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?
- C: Yes, I believe in the Holy Spirit; the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins; the (\(\frac{A}{2}\)) resurrection of the body; and the life everlasting. Amen.
- P: Is it your earnest purpose to continue steadfast in this faith and in the promise of your Baptism and, as a member of the Church, to be diligent in the use of the means of grace?
- C: Yes, with the help of God.
- P: Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given you the new birth of water and of the Spirit and has forgiven you all your sins, strengthen you with His grace to life everlasting.
- C: Amen.
- P: Let us pray: Almighty and eternal God, according to Your strict judgment You condemned the unbelieving world through the flood, yet according to Your great mercy You preserved believing Noah and his family, eight souls in all. You drowned hard-hearted Pharaoh and all his host in the Red Sea, yet led Your people Israel through the water on dry ground, foreshadowing this washing of Your Holy Baptism. Through the Baptism in the Jordan of Your beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, You sanctified and instituted all waters to be a blessed flood and a lavish washing away of sin. We pray that You would behold us according to Your boundless mercy and bless us with true faith by the Holy Spirit, that through this saving flood all sin in us, which has been inherited from Adam and which we ourselves have committed since, would be drowned and die. Grant that we be kept safe and secure in the holy Ark of the Christian Church, being separated from the multitude of unbelievers and serving Your name at all times with a fervent spirit and a joyful hope, so that, with all believers in Your promise, we would be declared worthy of eternal life; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.
