OUR REDEEMER PRACTICES CLOSED COMMUNION



The Sacrament of the Altar is the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine for us Christians to eat and drink, instituted by Christ Himself. As we receive this Sacrament, the oneness of fellowship at the Altar (I Corinthians 10:17) presupposes a oneness in doctrine with the Apostles (Acts 2:42). For this reason the congregations of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod have agreed to follow the Biblical and historical practice of Closed Communion. If you desire to receive the Lord's Supper and are not a communicant member of Our Redeemer or a sister congregation in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, we respectfully ask that you not commune this morning. Rather, we would invite you

to speak with Pastor Knox, Pastor Saunders, or Vicar Goodroad about Holy Communion and about becoming a communicant member of this congregation.



TODAY IS THE 2nd SUNDAY AFTER THE EPIPHANY OF OUR LORD The Epiphany Season, in which the Church now finds herself, is perhaps the least recognized part of the Church Year. The word Epiphany means "revelation" or "manifestation." Literally, it refers to something making itself known.

The word "epiphany" has been used in later history to describe the visit of a king to a favored city. He was greeted with pomp, feasting, and revelry; all at the king's expense! Upon his arrival, he granted generous gifts as signs of his favor. In this way, he made himself known to his people as a king.

The Epiphany of Jesus is our Lord's gracious "manifestation" to His people with signs and wonders by which He reveals Himself and His favor to His people. During the Epiphany season,

the appointed readings reveal how Jesus made Himself known through His miracles and teaching. For example, today in the reading we hear Andrew say, "We have found the Messiah." Not so fast Andrew. The Lord, the Messiah, made Himself known to you.


But the Epiphany season is more than a time to recall the historical evidence of Jesus' divinity. The Word of God serves also to reveal the Jesus, the gracious King, who continues to come to His waiting people upon whom He lavishes gifts. For that reason when the Church hears from the lips of John, "Behold, the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world" She then confesses her faith by singing, "O Christ, the Lamb of God, Thou takest away the sin of the world; have mercy on us . . . grant us Thy peace." The lavish gifts the Lamb of God brings are not silver and gold, but the gifts of His body and blood for the forgiveness of sins and life everlasting.

The color of Paraments in the Epiphany season is green. Green is the color of life and growth in the Church. The Church is alive because she draws her very life from Jesus who makes Himself known and gives His life to His people.






