The Sacrament of the Altar is the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine for us Christians to eat and drink, instituted by Christ Himself. As we receive this Sacrament, the oneness of fellowship at the Altar (I Corinthians 10:17) presupposes a oneness in doctrine with the Apostles (Acts 2:42). For this reason the congregations of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod have agreed to follow the Biblical and historical practice of Closed Communion. If you desire to receive the Lord's Supper and are not a communicant member of Our Redeemer or a sister congregation in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, we respectfully ask that you not commune this morning. Rather, we would invite you to speak with Pastor Knox,

Pastor Saunders, or Vicar Baker about Holy Communion and about becoming a communicant member of this congregation.

TODAY IS THE 4th SUNDAY AFTER THE EPIPHANY OF OUR LORD Much of Jesus' early public ministry is carried out in the area known as Galilee. This included his hometown of Nazareth, the villages of Capernaum and Bethsaida, as well as the familiar accounts which involved the Sea of Galilee such as the Sermon on the Mount, calming the storms, and many of His miracles.

But all of this activity was centered in His teaching. In Jesus' word, the will of God was being revealed. The Gospel for today states, "And they were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one who

had authority." Jesus' word has authority for it is spoken by God Himself. He has the authority, as is evidenced today, to drive out demons.

By that same authority, He deals with you. His authority calls you to repent of your sin. By that same authority, He, through His servant your Pastor, declares that your sin is forgiven.

His authority is over all His creation. So by His authority, the Church gathers in the name and remembrance of Jesus. She receives the created elements of bread and wine, but hears the authoritative voice of Jesus, "*This is my body, this is my blood, given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins.*" By the same authority that drove out demons, bread and wine become the means by which Jesus cares and nourishes His beloved bride. The people of Capernaum were astonished at this authority and so are His people today..
