# **OUR REDEEMER PRACTICES CLOSED COMMUNION**

The Sacrament of the Altar is the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine for us Christians to eat and drink, instituted by Christ Himself. As we receive this Sacrament, the oneness of fellowship at the Altar (I Corinthians 10:17) presupposes a oneness in doctrine with the Apostles (Acts 2:42). For this reason the congregations of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod have agreed to follow the Biblical and historical practice of Closed Communion. If you desire to receive the Lord's Supper and are not a communicant member of Our Redeemer or a sister congregation in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, we respectfully ask that you not commune this morning. Rather, we would invite you to speak with Pastor Knox, Pastor Saunders, or Vicar Baker about Holy Communion and about becoming a communicant member of this congregation.





TODAY IS THE 24<sup>th</sup> SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST The Church Year is nearing its completion. During the second half of the Church Year, known as the <u>Time of the Church</u>, we have been counting the weeks in relation to the Day of Pentecost, with ascending numbers -- the 1st, 5th, or 17th Sundays after Pentecost. Occasionally we have interrupted this count to observe a minor festival like last week's All Saints' Day, but the count kept going. As the numbers have grown higher, we know that the end is near.

What is it that the people of God are waiting for with such anticipation? The Holy Christian Church is waiting and watching for the promised glorious appearing of Her Savior. She confesses Her anticipation each week in the Creed - "And He will come again with glory to judge both the living and the dead, Whose kingdom

will have no end."

Through the inspired writers of the New Testament, God pictures this waiting like a bride waiting for the bridegroom. American customs of marriage do not help us understand this waiting, but the Jewish customs do. In the Jewish tradition, a woman was betrothed to a man; that is, the couple were promised to each other. As far as all were concerned, they were married, but they lived apart for a time. The groom was busy working to prepare a home where he could care for his new bride. His family and friends would prepare a feast. The bride knew that when all was ready the bridegroom would return, but she did not know exactly when. Shortly before the groom arrived, watchmen would cry out that he was near. The bride's friends would go out to meet him and escort him to her home where he would meet her. Then the entire group would travel to the banquet which had been prepared. For those who have been prepared for this banquet, the day of the groom's arrival is anxiously anticipated. But for those unprepared, as in the parable of the wise and foolish maidens before us today, scripture paints a much different picture,. For them, the picture is one of judgment, wailing and weeping, fear and everlasting punishment.

Many in this world are oblivious to the coming day of judgment and fulfillment. They scoff at the Word of God and use the cover of night to pursue their own sinful desires. Even those associated with the Church by outward appearances, but who neglect the gathering together of the Church to be fed by Word and Sacrament, will be unprepared. Yet the Word proclaimed by the Watchmen of God continues to speak of the day for which we wait.

As we wait, God's holy people sustain their hope by Christ's presence in Word and Sacrament. The foolish hear that Word, but do not respond in repentance and faith. For them the day of Christ's coming will be horrible. In contrast, the wise hear the Word, believe the promise that it brings, and joyously share in the meal of the new testament given by the Bridegroom to His friends as a sign of invitation to the Marriage Feast to come. All is now ready. The wise keep eager watch.

As you join with your fellow believers each Lord's Day in these final weeks of the Church Year, rest assured, Christ is at work keeping you ready and well prepared to receive Him when He comes again in Glory.
