THE 23rd SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST November 13, 2022



TODAY IS THE 23rd SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST It is also the 2nd to last Sunday in the Church Year. The road which Jesus sets before you in the Gospel appointed for this Sunday is one which would frighten even the strongest, bravest soul. Jesus, in clear and certain words, describes the events which will occur before His glorious appearing and especially what will befall those who bear His name.

Why does Jesus do this? Is He trying to scare His Church or manipulate His people through fear, doubt, or despair? Of course not! God does not need to, nor would He, use the tricks which sinful humanity or the devil would use to achieve an objective. God does not operate by the rule, "The end justifies the means."

Jesus speaks the truth. What He describes is not a mere possibility. Neither are the events He describes the fabricated lies and deception of a novelist trying to sensationalize the future. Jesus speaks the truth so that you know what is coming. Jesus speaks the truth so that you will realize that you are helpless if you try to pass through these things alone or by depending upon your own strength, resolve, and determination.

Jesus also speaks the truth so that you are not afraid when these events occur. As Jesus speaks the truth concerning the turmoil in society, the signs and wonders in the heavens and on the earth, and the persecution of those who bear the name of Christ, He also declares to you that you will pass through these things with Him! "Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away." Of this Jesus says there should be no doubt!

Jesus knows the way will be difficult. It will be fraught with danger and temptation. Knowing this He warns, "But watch yourselves, lest your hearts be weighed down with dissipation and drunkenness and cares of this life." How easy it is to neglect the very things that Christ has given to His Church, whereby He promises to be with Her and protect her in the face of such peril. Like blind beggars or isolated leppers, the Church can only cry out, "Lord, have mercy!"

Mercy is what you need and mercy is what God shows! The promise of the Baptismal font, the comfort of His voice, the strength of His forgiveness, the peace of His supper. For those who rely on these things, the future is real and certain. With the Psalmist the Church declares, "The Lord will keep your going out and your coming in from this time forth and forevermore."
