The Sacrament of the Altar is the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine for us Christians to eat and drink, instituted by Christ Himself. As we receive this Sacrament, the oneness of fellowship at the Altar (I Corinthians 10:17) presupposes a oneness in doctrine with the Apostles (Acts 2:42). For this reason the congregations of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod have agreed to follow the Biblical and historical practice of Closed Communion. If you desire to receive the Lord's Supper and are not a communicant member of Our Redeemer or a sister congregation in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, we respectfully ask that you not commune this morning. Rather, we would invite you to speak with Pastor Knox, Pastor Saunders, or Vicar Baker about Holy Communion and about becoming a communicant member of this congregation.

TODAY IS THE 25th SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST This is the second to last Sunday in the Church Year. This is the second of three Sundays at the end of the Church Year when the end of the world, Christ's visible appearing in glory for judgment, and the final consummation of God's eternal kingdom take center stage.

The Psalmist prays, "I wait for the Lord, my soul waits, and in His Word I put my hope." (Psalm 130:5) It is obvious that here, with all of humanity, the Psalmist is hoping and waiting for something better! Unfortunately, for many this "something better" is merely deliverance from the crosses we must bear in the

midst of the current tribulation. This is called, "The Theology of Glory" or also known as "health, wealth, and prosperity religion." Christ has not promised that He would remove your cross, at least not in this life. To the contrary, Jesus calls you to rejoice in your crosses as a sign of your place in God's kingdom. This is the difference between walking by sight and faith. The crosses that you bear now lead you to complete trust in God's grace and mercy.

The Gospel for today contains unsettling words as Jesus, in a parable, describes the day of judgment. "For to everyone who has will more be given, and he will have an abundance. But from the one who has not, even what he has will be taken away." If that were not enough, Jesus concludes the parable with this stern warning, "And cast the worthless servant into the outer darkness. In that place there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth."

By faith, the people of Christ's Church trust that through the work of Christ, and that work alone, they are the ones that "have." You have been given life and forgiveness. You have been given the right to be called "sons of God" and heirs of the heavenly kingdom. You have been given the promise of Baptism and the blessings of your Savior's body and blood.

You lack nothing, and so you wait! But to wait is not the same as sitting idly. As the Church waits, she occupies Her time with the things of God, that is, the things which God has given to sustain Her in Her journey. In the Hymn of The Day, Samuel Stone puts it this way in his beloved hymn, *The Church's One Foundation*,

One holy name She blesses, partakes one holy food, and to one hope She presses with ev'ry grace endued.

"With ev'ry grace endued" means that the Church has everything she needs to reach her final objective. To be endued means to be blessed, and certainly, you have been blessed. You have been washed by Christ in Holy Baptism and blessed with God's holy name. You have been taught by Christ in His Holy Word and you have been fed by Christ with the holy food of His body and blood. Therefore you wait and, with the Psalmist, you join in praying, "I wait for the Lord, my soul waits, and in His Word I put my hope."






