OUR REDEEMER PRACTICES CLOSED COMMUNION



The Sacrament of the Altar is the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine for us Christians to eat and drink, instituted by Christ Himself. As we receive this Sacrament, the oneness of fellowship at the Altar (I Corinthians 10:17) presupposes a oneness in doctrine with the Apostles (Acts 2:42). For this reason the congregations of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod have agreed to follow the Biblical and historical practice of Closed Communion. If you desire to receive the Lord's Supper and are not a communicant member of Our Redeemer or a sister congregation in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, we respectfully ask that you not commune this morning. Rather, we would invite you to speak with Pastor Knox,

Pastor Saunders, or Vicar Baker about Holy Communion and about becoming a communicant member of this congregation.

TODAY IS THE 26th SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST - The Last Sunday of the Church

Year. It is the third of three Sundays at the end of the Church Year in which the Lord's glorious return to judge the living and the dead is central.

Many in this world are oblivious to the coming day of our Lord's return. They scoff at the Word of God and use the cover of night to pursue their own sinful desires.

This is not new in your generation. Already in the first century, the Apostle Peter proclaimed to the Church, "This is now the second letter that I am writing to you, beloved. In both of them I am stirring up your sincere mind by way of reminder, that you should remember the predictions of the holy prophets and the commandment of the Lord and Savior through your apostles, knowing this first of all, that scoffers will come in the last days with scoffing, following their own sinful desires. They will say, 'Where is the promise of his coming?'" (II Peter 3)



But the Word proclaimed by the watchmen of God speaks of the day for which you wait. It is a day to look forward to with great anticipation, for the Church's hope is fixed in Jesus Christ "who is able to keep you from falling and to present you before his glorious presence without fault and with great joy." (Jude 24) When He appears, He will inaugurate a new, heavenly Jerusalem from which sin and death will be eternally banished.

As the Church waits for this day, Her hope is sustained by God's Word. The foolish hear that Word, but do not receive it in childlike faith. For them, the day of Christ's coming will be horrible. In contrast, the wise gather to hear the Word and keep eager watch for the Bridegroom's arrival.

The Scriptures picture heaven as a wedding banquet. Each Sunday throughout the Church Year, the people of God have rehearsed the work of the Bridegroom which makes the invitation to the heavenly banquet possible. In fact, the Bridegroom is already here with His Church. Having been given the proper wedding garments in Holy Baptism, the people of Christ's Church gather with their fellow wedding guests to share the body and the blood of their Lord. In the final words of the of the first distribution Hymn,

Feast after feast thus comes and passes by, Yet, passing, points to that glad feast above, Giving sweet foretaste of the festal joy, The Lamb's great marriage feast of bliss and love.

who with the Father and the Son together is worshiped and glorified,


who spoke by the prophets.
