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# THE FEAST OF ALL SAINTS

**November 6, 2022** 



**TODAY WE OBSERVE THE FEAST OF ALL SAINTS** The Feast of All Saints actually falls on November 1 but in the Church's practice it is customary to move it to a nearby Sunday. Today we rejoice in the victory that Christ has won for all people and which He has given to those who have lived and died in Him. God has called them forth from this vale of tears to the eternal blessedness of His glorious presence, and for them the time of waiting is over.

But for those of us who remain on earth the waiting continues. As we wait we do so with great expectancy because we know that the victory which the Saints who have gone before us now enjoy in

perfection is a victory in which the Saints on earth also share. While ours is still by faith and theirs is by sight, one day we will join with them in glory, around the throne of God, to worship the Lamb in His kingdom. Thus each week in the Communion Liturgy we confess,

With angels and archangels and with all the company of heaven we laud and magnify Your glorious name, evermore praising You and singing, 'Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God of Sabaoth; heav'n and earth are full of Thy glory; Hosanna, Hosanna, Hosanna in the highest.

This Feast Day, like other festivals, gives the Church the opportunity to do what the Scriptures and our Lutheran Confessions remind us is good and proper, that is, to remember God's gracious working in and through various persons to accomplish His saving work. The Lutheran Confessions speak in the following way concerning the saints:

"It is also taught among us that saints should be kept in remembrance so that our faith may be strengthened when we see what grace they received and how they were sustained by faith. Moreover, their good works are to be an example for us, each of us in his own calling."

While we on this day remember all who have died in Christ, in particular we remember those from our congregations who died during this past Church Year. We are thankful for the time God granted us together and we are thankful for the good they did and the example they left us. The Rite for the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed is included on the Insert in your bulletin. This Rite will incorporate the Prayer of the Church and will take place immediately after the Offertory.





# A Reading from I Thessalonians 4:13-18

Brothers, we do not want you to be uninformed about those who have fallen asleep, or to grieve like the rest of men, who have no hope. We believe that Jesus died and rose again and so we believe that God will bring with Jesus those who have fallen asleep in him. According to the Lord's own word, we tell you that we who are still alive, who are left until the coming of the Lord, will certainly not take precedence over those who have fallen asleep. For the Lord himself will come down from heaven, with a loud command, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet call of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first. After that, we who are still alive and are left will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And so we will be with the Lord forever. 


# III. THE SERVICE OF THE SACRAMENT


# **Prayer Before Communing**

# HYMN NOTES

A brief note about one of the hymns you will sing in church today.

#### "Oh, How Blest Are They Whose Toils Are Ended" - LSB #679

This hymn is different than most of the others in the "Church Triumphant" section of our hymnal. (LSB 670-680) While hymns like "For All The Saints" or "Ye Watchers And Ye Holy Ones" include majestic and triumphant praise and thanksgiving to God, this hymn is a bit more peaceful and reflective. There is a place for both in the Church's song.

Simon Dach, Lutheran pastor and professor, wrote mostly secular poetry in his early life. It was after the death of a close friend, Robert Roberthin, that Dach turned his attention to writing Christian hymns and poetry. Most of his adult life was lived during the horrors of the 30 Years' War and during his ministry he buried hundreds of people because of plagues. Many of his hymns dealt with trial and tribulation, and so Dach became known as the "Singer of Death." This doesn't diminish the significance of his hymns. Rising from his own personal experiences of hardship and poverty, his hymns and poetry confess both the realities of sin, death, and the grave while also faithfully confessing salvation, the certainty of the resurrection, and the glory of eternal life. Dach is credited with more than 150 hymns, two of which are included in LSB. The other familiar hymn we sing is "Through Jesus' Blood and Merit." (LSB 746)

Dach wrote this hymn on the occasion of the funeral of Hiob Lepner, the mayor of Königsberg Altstadt, where Dach was serving as professor at the University.

The hymn distinguishes two groups of saints: "those whose toils are ended" and those "still oppressed with sorrow and misgiving." The first group "are in their chambers sleeping." Though they are "set free from all their weeping" and enjoy "untroubled gladness" they still await the bodily resurrection from the grave. The second group, the ones who sing this hymn, are still "oppressed with sorrow and misgiving." We also must deal with the affects of the Fall, acknowledging that "our undertakings are but toils and troubles and heartbreakings."

It is comforting to know how blest are our loved ones who have gone before us but it is worth noting that Dach does not extol seeing our loved ones again. Rather, the hymn's final two verses describe the blessedness of being in the presence of Christ and concludes with a prayer that Christ would come and "lead us forth and cast this world behind us." Together then in eternity, all the Saints will, "with You, the Anointed" find "joy and rest appointed."
