THE 3rd SUNDAY IN ADVENT **December 11, 2022**



TODAY IS THE 3rd SUNDAY IN ADVENT As it was last Sunday, so again today, the Church's attention is drawn to the last of the Old Testament prophets, John the "Baptizer." It was noted in last Sunday's bulletin that it would be just as appropriate to call him John the "Preacher", for he is as well known for his preaching as for his baptizing.

But the Gospel account before the Church today tells us that John is no longer preaching and baptizing "beyond the Jordan." Like the prophets who had preceded him, John's preaching had resulted in opposition. He is now imprisoned and while in prison he had experienced doubt - Was Jesus really the

promised Messiah?

John sends some of his disciples to Jesus to inquire. Jesus' answer is to take John, and anyone who doubts, back to the prophetic scriptures. "The blind receive their sight and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised up, and the poor have good news preached to them." Jesus reminds John, and you as well, that the Messiah's work had been foretold in the Law and the Prophets. Jesus' public ministry was the fulfillment of those prophecies.

There are many voices and experiences in life that would seek to raise doubt in your hearts and minds with regard to who Jesus is and the certainty of your salvation in Him! Just as Jesus led John back to the prophetic Scriptures, so He would lead you back to the Scriptures of the Apostles and Prophets. These are the foundation of the Church, of which Jesus Christ is the Chief Cornerstone. Jesus speaks of Himself, but also of you when, after describing John as the greatest among those born of women, He says, "Yet the one who is least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he."

Of course He can say this about Himself but how can Jesus say this about you? Because your greatness in the kingdom of heaven is not based on what you have done, but on what you have received! You are baptized into the one who is greater than all, Jesus the Son of God, He willingly became the least in the kingdom of God by humbling Himself, even unto death on the cross, for you and for your redemption. You have, and continue, to receive of His righteousness each and every time you commune at the table He sets before you of His body and blood. Here there is no doubt. This is His body. This is His blood. Your sins are forgiven. Where doubt is removed, there is only one thing to say: Amen.

THEY'RE NOT PINK, THEY'RE ROSE This morning you see the Rose colored paraments which are only used twice each year. During the development of Liturgical practice, it became customary to use Rose colored paraments on the 3rd Sunday in Advent and the 4th Sunday in Lent instead of the Purple traditionally used with these Seasons. In old usage, today is called, "Gaudete" Sunday. Its counterpart

in the penitential season of Lent is called "Laetare" Sunday. These names come from the first word in the traditional Introit for each day which is translated "rejoice."


This was a subtle change from the penitence associated with Purple to a spirit of joy associated with Rose. The point of both days is to provide us encouragement as the Church progresses toward the end of each respective penitential season. This color change is not something new to most of you for you have already been accustomed to the lighting of the rose candle on the 3rd Sunday in Advent.





More clearly than any of the prophets of the Old Testament, Isaiah foretold the coming of the Messiah. He prepared God's people to meet their coming King. Remaining services include:

Wednesday, Dec. 14 – Isaiah 35:1-10

Wednesday, Dec. 21 – Isaiah 7:10–17

"Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call His name Immanuel."
