OUR REDEEMER PRACTICES CLOSED COMMUNION



The Sacrament of the Altar is the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine for us Christians to eat and drink, instituted by Christ Himself. As we receive this Sacrament, the oneness of fellowship at the Altar (I Corinthians 10:17) presupposes a oneness in doctrine with the Apostles (Acts 2:42). For this reason the congregations of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod have agreed to follow the Biblical and historical practice of Closed Communion. If you desire to receive the Lord's Supper and are not a communicant member of Our Redeemer or a sister congregation in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, we respectfully ask that you not commune this morning. Rather, we would invite you to speak with Pastor Knox,

Pastor Saunders, or Vicar Baker about Holy Communion and about becoming a communicant member of this congregation.

TODAY IS THE 3rd SUNDAY IN ADVENT As it was last Sunday, so again today, the Church's attention is drawn to the last of the Old Testament prophets, John the "Baptizer." It was noted in last Sunday's bulletin that it would be just as appropriate to call him John the "Preacher" for he is as well known for his preaching as for his baptizing.

You heard from last week's Gospel that "John wore clothing made of camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist." (Mark 1:6). The camel's hair and leather belt were not worn because John was eccentric in any way, or because he was looking for some way to draw unnecessary attention to himself. He chose his clothing because it reflected who he was - a prophet of God.

Elijah, the great prophet of the Old Testament, wore "a garment of hair with a leather belt around his waist." (2 Kings 1:8). Other Old Testament prophets likewise wore "a prophet's garment of hair." (Zech. 13:4). In the same manner, when St. John comes to be a prophet, he comes looking the way a prophet ought to look, dressing the way a prophet ought to dress. This way, the people will understand who St. John claims to be - he is not just a madman raving in the desert. He is one who speaks on behalf of God, and he dresses for his duties.

Your Pastor wears unusual clothes when you gather here with him, not in the wilderness beyond the Jordan, but here in God's house. The vestments he wears don't make him what he is but do reveal, that like John, he is God's servant in this place, speaking on behalf of God. Like John, the work of all pastors is to be a preacher of "Christ crucified" (1 Corinthians 1:23) and point those who gather here today to "Christ, the Lamb of God," who, as He is present with His body and blood, "takes away the sins of the world."




THEY'RE NOT PINK, THEY'RE ROSE This morning you see the Rose colored paraments which are only used twice each year. During the development of Liturgical practice, it became customary to use Rose colored paraments on the 3rd Sunday in Advent and the 4th Sunday in Lent instead of the Purple traditionally used with these Seasons. In old usage, today is called, "Gaudete" Sunday. Its counterpart

in the penitential season of Lent is called "Laetare" Sunday. These names come from the first word in the traditional Introit for each day which is translated "rejoice."

This was a subtle change from the penitence associated with Purple to a spirit of joy associated with Rose. The point of both days is to provide us encouragement as the Church progresses toward the end of each respective penitential season. This color change is not something new to most of you for you have already been accustomed to the lighting of the rose candle on the 3rd Sunday in Advent.

BECAUSE ADVENT IS A PENITENTIAL SEASON we observe a few liturgical changes.

- We omit the singing of the Gloria in Excelsis. (p. 187-189)
- We do not make use of flowers. The exception to this is today the 3rd Sunday in Advent, Gaudete Sunday, the Sunday you also see the Rose colored paraments.
