THE 4th SUNDAY IN ADVENT **December 18, 2022**

TODAY IS THE 4th SUNDAY IN ADVENT For three weeks you have heard the proclamation of God's messengers, calling the faithful people of God to readiness and watchfulness. These messengers were God's chosen prophets, Isaiah and John specifically, who, through the preaching of repentance and faith in God's merciful promise of a Savior, gathered the remnant of Israel to receive the blessings of God's kingdom.



In today's Gospel, the messenger is an angel, speaking to Joseph and announcing that the woman to whom he was engaged was going to have a baby. "Do not fear to take Mary as your wife," the angel says, "for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit." Not only was Joseph not to be afraid to take Mary to be his wife, the angel also reveals that Mary would be His chosen instrument to give birth to the Savior. "She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." In this way, Mary is used by God to fulfill the promise spoken through the prophet Isaiah that He Himself would redeem Israel from all her sins. Mary is the servant of God through whom the Servant of all mankind assumes His role as Savior.

Joseph believed the word that the angel had spoken. So must you! The child that was conceived in the womb of the virgin Mary was, and is, Immanuel, "God with us." He is with you today bringing forgiveness and salvation in the Word that you hear and in the Sacrament you receive. "This is my body... This is my blood." Not only is Immanuel "God with us" in the Sacrament of the Altar, He is "God for you" as you believe what is said and you receive His flesh and blood for the forgiveness of your sins. How do you know this? God has declared it by His messengers through His Holy Word.
