OUR REDEEMER PRACTICES CLOSED COMMUNION



The Sacrament of the Altar is the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine for us Christians to eat and drink, instituted by Christ Himself. As we receive this Sacrament, the oneness of fellowship at the Altar (I Corinthians 10:17) presupposes a oneness in doctrine with the Apostles (Acts 2:42). For this reason the congregations of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod have agreed to follow the Biblical and historical practice of Closed Communion. If you desire to receive the Lord's Supper and are not a communicant member of Our Redeemer or a sister congregation in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, we respectfully ask that you not commune this morning. Rather, we would invite you to speak with Pastor Knox,

Pastor Saunders, or Vicar Baker about Holy Communion and about becoming a communicant member of this congregation.

TODAY IS THE 1st SUNDAY IN ADVENT. It is also the 1st Sunday of the New Church Year so "Blessed New Year!" The first season of the Church Year is called Advent. Advent is very important as a time of preparation for Our Lord's coming therefore every Lutheran ought to know about the significance and meaning of Advent.

The theme of Advent is indicated by where it falls in the Church Year. Advent comes "between" the end of the Pentecost Season and the beginning of the Christmas Season. As you have listened to the Word of God over the Last Three Sundays of the Church Year, the emphasis has been on the end of all things—the end of life, the remembrance of all the blessed dead, the Last Day, and the hope of the resurrection. Looking

forward, the Christmas Season deals with Our Lord's coming in human flesh to bear mankind's sin and be their Savior.

Advent brings to the Church's attention a three-fold coming of Our Lord:

- His coming as Redeemer in flesh to bear man's sin,
- His coming as Savior to dwell in men by the Sacrament of the Altar, and
- His glorious promised Second Coming as Judge.

God's people should not be surprised to learn, then, that the word "Advent" means "coming."

The beginning of a new Church Year, like the end, reminds the Church that she stands that much closer to the day when Christ will appear for judgment day. At the same time, the Church readies herself during this season to remember His birth. Such is the tension of the Christian life, for Christians live in "the time between the times." You are, at one and the same time, ever ready to go home to glory, yet ever ready to invest yourselves in the tasks of today, with an eye on tomorrow. You prepare your earthly homes and families for yet another Christmas even as you look forward to your final rest in your heavenly home with the whole family of God.





On this 1st Sunday in the Church Year the cry, "Hosanna, blessed Is He who comes in the name of the Lord" echoes in the church. These words, spoken of old by the prophets (Psalm 118:25) and repeated on the day that the Lord entered Jerusalem, are still heard in the Church throughout the year because the Lord still comes to His people. He comes in the water of Holy Baptism. He comes in the word of Absolution. He comes in the word which is preached. He comes in the bread and wine as He feeds the Baptized with His body and blood. The one who is "blessed" comes with the blessings of forgiveness, life, and salvation.

BECAUSE ADVENT IS A PENITENTIAL SEASON we observe a few liturgical changes.

- We omit the singing of the Gloria in Excelsis. (p. 187-189)
- ➤ We do not make use of flowers. The exception to this is on the 3rd Sunday in Advent, Gaudete Sunday, the Sunday you will also see the Rose colored paraments.



who with the Father and the Son together is worshiped and glorified,




