#### **OUR REDEEMER PRACTICES CLOSED COMMUNION**



The Sacrament of the Altar is the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine for us Christians to eat and drink, instituted by Christ Himself. As we receive this Sacrament, the oneness of fellowship at the Altar (I Corinthians 10:17) presupposes a oneness in doctrine with the Apostles (Acts 2:42). For this reason the congregations of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod have agreed to follow the Biblical and historical practice of Closed Communion. If you desire to receive the Lord's Supper and are not a communicant member of Our Redeemer or a sister congregation in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, we respectfully ask that you not commune this morning. Rather, we would invite you to speak with Pastor Knox,

Pastor Saunders, or Vicar Baker about Holy Communion and about becoming a communicant member of this congregation.

TODAY IS THE FIRST SUNDAY AFTER CHRISTMAS The Church Year moves quickly from the birth narrative of Jesus to His life lived as the perfect substitute for sinful humanity. As Jesus lived His life in complete obedience to the Law, He did so to fulfill the Law for you. This is called His <u>Active Obedience</u>. Jesus also suffered and died under the curse of the Law, because of your sins. He offered Himself as the perfect sacrifice for sins which He accepted as your substitute. This is called His <u>Passive Obedience</u>. Because Jesus fulfilled the Law perfectly for you and for all people, those who trust in Him can sing with

Simeon this day, "Lord, now let your servant depart in peace, according to Your Word, for my eyes have seen Your salvation, which You have prepared in the sight of all people, a light to lighten the Gentiles and the glory of Your people Israel."

These are the words of what the Church now knows as the "Nunc Dimittis," which are sung in the Communion Liturgy. As Simeon beheld the Christ in the flesh there in the temple, so you too, by faith, "see" the Christ in the flesh, as He comes to you with His body and blood in the bread and wine of the Sacrament of the Altar. Through faith in Christ, you too have peace with God.



Today we also hear and learn of Anna, called a prophetess, who likewise beholds Jesus in the temple. Now with sins forgiven and filled with the hope and certainty of salvation in Christ, we like Anna, "Give thanks to God and . . . speak of Him to all who were waiting for the redemption of Jerusalem."".

who spoke by the prophets.


