OUR REDEEMER PRACTICES CLOSED COMMUNION



The Sacrament of the Altar is the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine for us Christians to eat and drink, instituted by Christ Himself. As we receive this Sacrament, the oneness of fellowship at the Altar (I Corinthians 10:17) presupposes a oneness in doctrine with the Apostles (Acts 2:42). For this reason the congregations of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod have agreed to follow the Biblical and historical practice of Closed Communion. If you desire to receive the Lord's Supper and are not a communicant member of Our Redeemer or a sister congregation in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, we respectfully ask that you not commune this morning. Rather, we would invite you to speak with Pastor Knox,

Pastor Saunders, or Vicar Baker about Holy Communion and about becoming a communicant member of this congregation.

<u>TODAY THE CHURCH YEAR</u> marks the festival of the "Transfiguration of our Lord." The Transfiguration is the culmination of the Epiphany season, and stands at the threshold of the season of Lent which begins this week with the Ash Wednesday service.

As you look back to the Epiphany Season now ending, you can recall many events which have marked the life of Jesus, whereby He has revealed that He is true God: His Baptism with the anointing by the Holy Spirit and the voice from heaven of the Father, His miracles, and His teaching. Throughout Epiphany the Gospel accounts have pointed you to the divinity of Christ and to the glory His human nature possessed.

As the Church looks forward, the season of Lent is before her. During Lent the Scriptures will direct you to Jesus' purposeful movement toward the Mount of Calvary where He suffers and dies for the sins of the whole world. Before you leave the Epiphany season, there is one more event in the life of Jesus you will observe - the revelation of His divine glory on the Mountain of Transfiguration.

Today you receive a glimpse of Jesus' eternal glory which He shares with His Church through Word and Sacrament. That glory was manifested in the light that shone at Bethlehem and again as the light which shone on the Mountain of Transfiguration.

But the death of the transfigured Christ is God's greatest revelation of glory. Nowhere does God's glory shine more brightly than as the light which pierces the darkness of Calvary. There the Christ gives himself for us as the sacrifice for the sins of all humanity, and the mercy of God is revealed for sinners.

That same light was revealed as each of you were brought to the font in the darkness of sin and death and yet departed sharing in Christ who is the light of the world. You partake of that glory again today as He, the one of whom the Father says, "This is my beloved Son; listen to him." gives you His body and blood to eat and to drink.

This momentary glory prepares you for your journey to heavenly Jerusalem where His glory will never be hidden.

FAREWELL, ALLELUIA

* You will note the use of a "Final Hymn" this morning which is not our custom. We don't normally sing a Final Hymn because the Lord's Benediction is the "Last Word" of the Service. Today, however this Final Hymn, which follows the Benediction, serves to prepare us for the season of Lent which begins this Wednesday.


In a sense, this Hymn is a "<u>Farewell to Alleluia</u>." Because of the penitence associated with Lent, the word "Alleluia" (which means "Praise to Yahweh") will not be heard again in the Church's hymns or Liturgy until the festival of the Resurrection begins at the Easter Vigil.

The Service begins with a Procession.


After the Bell rings, please rise to face the Processional Crucifix and the singing of the Processional Hymn.


