## **OUR REDEEMER PRACTICES CLOSED COMMUNION**



The Sacrament of the Altar is the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine for us Christians to eat and drink, instituted by Christ Himself. As we receive this Sacrament, the oneness of fellowship at the Altar (I Corinthians 10:17) presupposes a oneness in doctrine with the Apostles (Acts 2:42). For this reason the congregations of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod have agreed to follow the Biblical and historical practice of Closed Communion. If you desire to receive the Lord's Supper and are not a communicant member of Our Redeemer or a sister congregation in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, we respectfully ask that you not commune this morning. Rather, we would invite you to speak with Pastor Knox,


Pastor Saunders, or Vicar Baker about Holy Communion and about becoming a communicant member of this congregation.

<u>TODAY IS THE 2<sup>nd</sup> SUNDAY IN LENT</u> Sin is serious business! Do you ever feel ashamed because of the sins that you commit? During this Lenten season you will be reminded again and again that you should be ashamed. God, who is holy and just, is grieved by your sin and has warned that His righteous anger will be revealed against all sin and workers of iniquity.

Being ashamed is a very good thing when it comes to your sin, because God uses it to remind you how much you need the redemption found only in Jesus Christ. God causes you to feel your shame, not so that you will perish, but rather so that you will seek His mercy and find His gifts of forgiveness in His Word and His Holy Sacraments.




During these forty days of Lent, consider Jesus' last forty days. He thought of nothing else than the seriousness of your sin. Jesus spent these forty days with only one objective, and that objective was to complete His journey to Jerusalem and there give Himself into death. Jesus died because He took your sin seriously and He takes you seriously. Listen to Jesus and He will show you the shame of your sin. Do not listen to Satan because he wants you to be ashamed of Jesus. Today, against the attacks of the devil, Jesus arms you with His Word and His own Body and Blood so that, when He comes in His Father's glory, He will not be ashamed of you, but will safely bring you home to be with Him forever!






