## **OUR REDEEMER PRACTICES CLOSED COMMUNION**



The Sacrament of the Altar is the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine for us Christians to eat and drink, instituted by Christ Himself. As we receive this Sacrament, the oneness of fellowship at the Altar (I Corinthians 10:17) presupposes a oneness in doctrine with the Apostles (Acts 2:42). For this reason the congregations of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod have agreed to follow the Biblical and historical practice of Closed Communion. If you desire to receive the Lord's Supper and are not a communicant member of Our Redeemer or a sister congregation in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, we respectfully ask that you not commune this morning. Rather, we would invite you to speak with Pastor Knox,

Pastor Saunders, or Vicar Baker about Holy Communion and about becoming a communicant member of this congregation.

**TODAY IS THE FIFTH SUNDAY AFTER THE EPIPHANY OF OUR LORD** During the Epiphany season, the Gospel reveals that Jesus is truly God. The Gospel tells of Jesus' actions which only God could do. He heals the sick, gives sight to the blind, drives out demons, and even raises the dead.

Today is no exception. Jesus is still in Capernaum. While in the Synagogue, He has driven a demon from a man possessed. Jesus healed many who were sick and demon possessed. Most of those whom Jesus heals are strangers to Him in the sense that He has never met them before. On this occasion though, the Gospel also tells of Jesus healing one with whom He has a more intimate connection, namely, the mother-in-law of Peter. She has a fever. Jesus touches her. She is made well. From there the Gospel goes on to say, "And he healed many who were sick with various diseases, and cast out many demons." (Mark

1:34)

"Where is that Jesus today?" you may ask. You have loved ones who are sick. You yourself may be suffering from some sort of affliction or disease. Why doesn't Jesus come to relieve all of these problems?


The answer to the second question will help answer the first. Sickness and disease are only symptoms—symptoms of creation's fall into sin. Jesus dealt with these symptoms during His public ministry for a twofold reason. First, to reveal Himself as the Son of God and the promised Messiah. Second, to reveal Himself as a gracious God who sympathizes with His creation in their suffering.

Jesus public ministry was not about dealing with <u>symptoms</u>. Rather, He came to deal with the <u>cause</u> which lies behind these symptoms. Healing a sickness or disease might relieve suffering for a moment, but ultimately would leave the one suffering, still dead in their trespasses and sin. Jesus came to overcome sin, death, and the grave for you and all those suffering under the curse of the Fall.

Suffering varies from individual to individual. Christ calls you through suffering, regardless of its nature, to look beyond the moment, to the promise of victory over sin, death, and the grave. This victory is yours already and it is a victory which will endure for eternity. You were buried with Christ and raised with Him through Baptism into His name. The Lord, whose body was crucified for you, gives you to eat of His flesh and drink of His blood, that you might receive the pledge and guarantee of His fulfilled work on your behalf.

That is the answer to the first question. Where is the Jesus who has compassion on our suffering? He's right where He promised to be—in His Word and Sacraments. There, through the forgiveness of your sin, He manifests His love and mercy by dealing with the cause of your problems rather than just the symptoms. When will all the symptoms of death be gone? On the day of the resurrection. The Apostle Paul makes it clear in I Corinthians – "The last enemy to be destroyed is death." (I Cor. 15:26)






