# **OUR REDEEMER PRACTICES CLOSED COMMUNION**



The Sacrament of the Altar is the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine for us Christians to eat and drink, instituted by Christ Himself. As we receive this Sacrament, the oneness of fellowship at the Altar (I Corinthians 10:17) presupposes a oneness in doctrine with the Apostles (Acts 2:42). For this reason the congregations of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod have agreed to follow the Biblical and historical practice of Closed Communion. If you desire to receive the Lord's Supper and are not a communicant member of Our Redeemer or a sister congregation in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, we respectfully ask that you not commune this morning. Rather, we would invite you to speak with Pastor Knox,

Pastor Saunders, or Vicar Goodroad about Holy Communion and about becoming a communicant member of this congregation.

TODAY IS THE 5<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY AFTER THE EPIPHANY The Christian Church is a teaching church, and today's Epistle reading tells us exactly how the church does this teaching. Just like anything in life, it is vital to first teach the fundamentals before moving on to the more complex and technical details. It is common sense that if you are teaching a child to play baseball for the first time, it doesn't help to tell him how to get a curveball to paint the inside corner of the strike-zone if he doesn't even know how to throw the ball in the

The Apostle Paul exercised this common sense in his mission work at Corinth during his 2<sup>nd</sup> missionary

journey. Today's epistle begins with his description of those times, "And I, when I came to you, brothers, did not come proclaiming to you the testimony of God with lofty speech or wisdom. For I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ and him crucified." If Paul were universally condemning the practice of lofty speech or wisdom, he would be throwing stones straight through the walls of his own glass house. Paul himself uses lofty speech in many places across his epistles. and in the very next paragraph he says, "Yet among the mature we do impart wisdom." Paul is not saying "wisdom is bad, Jesus is good," but he's teaching about proper priorities. If you don't even believe in Jesus Christ and trust in His sacrificial death on the cross to ransom humanity from all sin, then none of the other teachings of Christianity are going to ultimately do you any

So, in the Christian Church you are taught according to this biblical wisdom. You are taught doctrines of Scripture other than the crucifixion of Jesus because they are also important. If they weren't important, the omniscient Holy Spirit would not have put them in the Bible. But you will never go very far into the Divine Service without a refresher on the chief doctrine of the Christian Church: the atoning death of Christ.

You also structure your week in this way. Since you know that a firm faith in Jesus is the most important thing in your entire life, you begin every week by gathering together with your fellow believers around the means of grace which Jesus has provided to keep you in this faith. As you approach the table of our Lord this day to receive His body and blood for the salvation of your soul, the first words of the first distribution hymn will direct you to the foundation for your faith and existence, "Since Christ has full atonement made and brought to us salvation, each Christian therefore may be glad and build on this foundation." (LSB 555:6)






