OUR REDEEMER PRACTICES CLOSED COMMUNION



The Sacrament of the Altar is the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine for us Christians to eat and drink, instituted by Christ Himself. As we receive this Sacrament, the oneness of fellowship at the Altar (I Corinthians 10:17) presupposes a oneness in doctrine with the Apostles (Acts 2:42). For this reason the congregations of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod have agreed to follow the Biblical and historical practice of Closed Communion. If you desire to receive the Lord's Supper and are not a communicant member of Our Redeemer or a sister congregation in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, we respectfully ask that you not commune this morning. Rather, we would invite you to speak with Pastor Knox,

Pastor Saunders, or Vicar Baker about Holy Communion and about becoming a communicant member of this congregation.

TODAY IS PALM SUNDAY but is sometimes also called The Sunday of the Passion. The Service begins with a reading of the Palm Sunday account. Then the joyful "Procession of Palms" reflects the contrasting attitudes toward Jesus which were on display during the days leading up to His crucifixion.

"Palm Sunday" is named after the palms that were spread before Jesus as He entered Jerusalem. The acclamation of the people, "Hosanna to the Son of David. Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord," clearly reveals that they hailed Jesus as the messianic king. Yet only days later, our Lord would hear the cry "Crucify him. Crucify him." This contrast is reflected on this day as the joy of His triumphal entry into Jerusalem gives way to the somber, yet hopeful remembrance of His passion. The extended



reading from the passion narrative sets before the faithful all that our Lord did "for us and for our salvation." Thus the Church is prepared to once again enter Holy Week, the chief week of the entire Church Year.

Back in Advent, on the 1st Sunday in the Church Year you heard the cry, "*Blessed Is He who comes in the name of the Lord*." These words, spoken of old by the prophet and repeated on the day that the Lord entered Jerusalem, are still heard in the Church throughout the year because the Lord still comes to His people. He comes in the water of Holy Baptism. He comes in the word of forgiveness proclaimed by those He sends. He comes in the bread and wine as He feeds the Baptized with His body and blood. The one who is "blessed" comes with the blessings of forgiveness, life, and salvation.

- C: in the name of the Lord.



who with the Father and the Son together is worshiped and glorified,




