OUR REDEEMER PRACTICES CLOSED COMMUNION



The Sacrament of the Altar is the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine for us Christians to eat and drink, instituted by Christ Himself. As we receive this Sacrament, the oneness of fellowship at the Altar (I Corinthians 10:17) presupposes a oneness in doctrine with the Apostles (Acts 2:42). For this reason the congregations of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod have agreed to follow the Biblical and historical practice of Closed Communion. If you desire to receive the Lord's Supper and are not a communicant member of Our Redeemer or a sister congregation in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, we respectfully ask that you not commune this morning. Rather, we would invite you

to speak with Pastor Knox, Pastor Saunders, or Vicar Goodroad about Holy Communion and about becoming a communicant member of this congregation.

TODAY IS THE FIFTH SUNDAY IN LENT The Gospel readings throughout Lent have drawn you closer and closer to Jerusalem as Jesus makes His way to the place of your salvation. As the time of Jesus' public ministry passed, His words became increasingly clear. St. Matthew puts it this way, "From that time on Jesus began to explain to His disciples that he <u>must</u> go to Jerusalem and suffer many things at the hands of the elders, chief priests, and teachers of the law, and that He <u>must</u> be killed and on the third day be raised to life." (Matt. 16:21)

In the Gospel for today, Jesus makes it obvious that the time for His passion was drawing near. Following the miraculous raising of Lazarus, Jesus immediately is plotted against by the chief priests and the Pharisees.

St. John tells the Church, "So from that day on they made plans to put him to death."

In the next few weeks, you will again hear, in the gracious words of the Scriptures, the growing opposition to Jesus and finally the fulfillment of His prophecy that He would, indeed, suffer and die. You, like Peter and others who knew and loved Jesus, may be tempted to say, "May this never be!" How foolish they were and how foolish it would be for you to think in this same fashion. Just as Jesus told John the Baptist at the beginning of the Epiphany season, "It is necessary to fulfill all righteousness" so, too, must Jesus endure what this prophecy foretells. Make no mistake about it, the death of Jesus was necessary for your salvation! Through Holy Baptism, you have been united to the death of Jesus. Each of you who bear the holy name of God, through the gracious water of baptismal regeneration, now share in the forgiveness and life which Jesus earned for all. Living in Christ, you now continue to draw your life from Him as you listen to His word, receive His absolution, and feast at the table He has prepared for you. With His resurrected body and blood Jesus pledges you anew that His death was for you and for your salvation.
