# Palm Sunday - The Sunday of the Passion April 2, 2023



**TODAY IS PALM SUNDAY** but is sometimes also called The Sunday of the Passion. The Service begins with a reading of the Palm Sunday account. Then the joyful "Procession of Palms" reflects the contrasting attitudes toward Jesus which were on display during the days leading up to His crucifixion.

"Palm Sunday" is named after the palms that were spread before Jesus as He entered Jerusalem. The acclamation of the people, "Hosanna to the Son of David. Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord," clearly reveals that they hailed Jesus as the messianic king. Yet only days later, our Lord would hear the cry "Crucify him. Crucify him." This contrast is reflected on this day as the joy of His triumphal entry into Jerusalem gives way to the somber, yet hopeful remembrance of His passion. The

extended reading from the passion narrative sets before the faithful all that our Lord did "for us and for our salvation." Thus the Church is prepared to once again enter Holy Week, the chief week of the entire Church Year.

Back in Advent, on the 1st Sunday in the Church Year you heard the cry, "Blessed Is He who comes in the name of the Lord." These words, spoken of old by the prophet and repeated on the day that the Lord entered Jerusalem, are still heard in the Church throughout the year because the Lord still comes to His people. He comes in the water of Holy Baptism. He comes in the word of forgiveness proclaimed by those He sends. He comes in the bread and wine as He feeds the Baptized with His body and blood. The one who is "blessed" comes with the blessings of forgiveness, life, and salvation.

I acknowledge one Baptism for the remission of sins,



# **DISTRICT/SYNOD ANNOUNCEMENTS**

<u>THE LCMS COMMISSION ON THEOLOGY AND CHURCH RELATIONS</u> (CTCR) has published a new report entitled, "<u>A Chaste and Decent Life: An Update to Human Sexuality 1981</u>." This report affirms the propositions found in the 1981 document and addresses issues that have arisen since that time.

A Chaste and Decent Life concludes, "In keeping with the venerable tradition of Luther's catechism, the Commission urges the Christian ethic of 'a chaste and decent life' as a model for how Christians should live in a culture that denies its basic moral foundations. ... Chastity should govern how we view our sexual identity and sexual activity, our sexual thoughts and sexual behaviors, our relationships with brothers and sisters in Christ, with husbands and wives in the flesh. Above all, it finds in Jesus Christ — the incarnate, crucified, and risen Lord, the Savior of sinners and all creation, the author and perfector of our faith — the perfect example of chastity and decency. This Lord Jesus laid aside His rightful heavenly glory, withstood the temptations of the devil, became the perfect sacrifice upon the cross, rose from the dead, and accomplished the forgiveness of our sins. He has done what no sinful human being could. God's Word urges us to lead holy lives, by doing as Christ Himself did and taught us to do (Eph. 5:1–10). Yet, more than that, God's Word also offers forgiveness. God's Word offers forgiveness to those who have sinned sexually. God's Word finally offers the healing truth of who we are and how we were created, that through repentance and faith we might in the Holy Spirit's power seek to live chaste and decent lives sexually until Christ returns to end all temptation and sin forever."

LCMS President Rev. Dr. Matthew C. Harrison recommends the people of the LCMS read and study this report. "This extensive update from the LCMS Commission on Theology and Church Relations (CTCR) on its own commendable statement on human sexuality from 1981 will assist the church to navigate the difficult current challenges to both chastity and decency. A Chaste and Decent Life guides the church through the turbulent waters of sexual identity issues and rampant sexual permissiveness. Yet this wonderful document also encourages each reader to consider his or her vocation and to serve God accordingly."
