OUR REDEEMER PRACTICES CLOSED COMMUNION



The Sacrament of the Altar is the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine for us Christians to eat and drink, instituted by Christ Himself. As we receive this Sacrament, the oneness of fellowship at the Altar (I Corinthians 10:17) presupposes a oneness in doctrine with the Apostles (Acts 2:42). For this reason the congregations of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod have agreed to follow the Biblical and historical practice of Closed Communion. If you desire to receive the Lord's Supper and are not a communicant member of Our Redeemer or a sister congregation in the Lutheran

Church-Missouri Synod, we respectfully ask that you not commune this morning. Rather, we would invite you to speak with Pastor Knox, Pastor Saunders, or Vicar Goodroad about Holy Communion and about becoming a communicant member of this congregation.

TODAY IS THE 6th SUNDAY OF EASTER. Christian - Do you take this name for granted? Have you become so accustomed to using it when referring to yourself or to the Church that you have forgotten what it means?

The early followers of Jesus were not called Christians. For example, some were called those "who belong to the Way." (Acts 9:2) Elsewhere, they are simply called "believers" (Acts 1:15) or "brothers." (Acts 6:3; Acts 7:2) In Acts 11:26, St. Luke tells us, "The disciples were called Christians first at Antioch."

The name "Christian" was not a self-chosen name. In fact, it was unbelievers, namely the Greeks, who called the followers of Jesus, Christians. In only two other places does this term get used in the Bible. In Acts 26:28 St. Paul is on trial before King Agrippa. Paul is clearly confessing the truth of the Faith to the King. The King responds, "Do you think that in such a short time you can persuade me to be a <u>Christian</u>?" Here Agrippa is using the term Christian to simply mean, "One who follows Christ."


In I Peter 4, the term is used differently. Here St. Peter writes, "Rejoice that you participate in the sufferings of Christ, so that you may be overjoyed when His glory is revealed. If you are insulted because of the name of Christ, you are blessed, for the Spirit of glory and of God rests on you. If you suffer, it should not be as a murderer or thief or any other kind of criminal, or even as a meddler. However, if you suffer as a <u>Christian</u>, do not be ashamed, <u>but praise God that you bear that name</u>."


As a Christian, you are a follower of Christ and You bear His name! Literally, you are "in Christ." The Gospel for this day from John 14, a part of Jesus' final discourse with His disciples on the night in which He was betrayed, speaks very clearly to this understanding of being a Christian. Listen to these, the words of Jesus, "Because I live, you also will live. On that day you will realize that I am in my Father, and you are in Me, and I am in you."

Jesus' words are fulfilled in the working of the Holy Spirit whom He has poured out upon you in the gracious, life-giving water of Holy Baptism. As one who now "lives, breathes, and has their being" in Christ, you come to the table where He joins Himself to you in the eating of His flesh and drinking of His blood. This is truly Holy Communion!

MEET YOUR NEXT VICAR AND FAMILY - MATTHEW AND PAMELA BAKER, LOGAN, CAMDEN, BRIGHTON, AND LINCOLN

Prior to moving to Fort Wayne, Matthew was a life-long resident of South Dakota. His family—parents, James and Robin, and four younger sisters—lived on a farm near Fairfax and were active members of Trinity Lutheran Church. Pamela grew up in Sergeant Bluff, IA, with her parents, Herman—who died March 30 this year after five years with Alzheimer's Disease—and Sandra. She has two older sisters who were out of high school by the time she was in elementary school.

Both Matthew and Pamela studied vocal music at South Dakota State University and were introduced by their voice instructor. During their time in Brookings (2003–2008), they attended

Mount Calvary Lutheran Church where Pamela was catechized into the Lutheran church and where the two were married on June 7, 2008.

They spent five years in Rapid City, SD (2008–2013), both directing choirs and teaching vocal music—Matthew with the Rapid City Children's Chorus and at St. Elizabeth Seton Elementary School (Rapid City Catholic Schools); Pamela at West Middle School and Stevens High School (Rapid City Area Schools). While in Rapid City, they attended Bethlehem Lutheran Church, teaching Sunday school, playing organ, and directing the adult choir.

In 2013, they decided to move back to Brookings where Matthew accepted a job teaching music at Hillcrest and Dakota Prairie Elementary Schools (Brookings Public Schools). After teaching preschool at Peace Lutheran Early Childhood Center for a short time, Pamela opted to teach private piano and voice lessons from home and began homeschooling their boys. In addition to regularly attending worship and Bible study at Mount Calvary, they assisted with several projects and filled various roles during their eight years there. Matthew was a Sunday school teacher, choir director, campus ministry coordinator, and church council leader. Pamela was an organist, choir director, member of the Board of Evangelism, and LWML president. Their experiences at Mount Calvary and especially their close friendships with their pastors' families were vital in bringing them to Concordia Theological Seminary in 2021.

Matthew's interests include gardening, biking, and woodworking. Pamela's are cooking, baking, and scrapbooking.

Logan (9) and Camden (6) enjoy several sports, but are most interested now in basketball and baseball. They like to look at, learn about, and talk about sports cars. (Ask them what they hope to drive someday.) They inherited a love of LEGO and many sets from their father. They're both avid readers. (This they did not inherit from their father.) Their very favorite thing to do is visit Grandpa and Grandma's farm with their 10 cousins.

In February 2019, Matthew and Pamela's third child, Jordan, died in the first eight weeks of pregnancy. He/she is buried in Brookings.

Brighton (3) and his shadow, Lincoln (1), are especially fond of toy cars and any kind of ball. They're very interested in dinosaurs—looking at dinosaur books, playing with toy dinosaurs, and pretending to be dinosaurs. Bluey is their favorite TV character, and the Bluey soundtrack is part of almost any road trip. They, too, are big fans of books—looking at them alone and being read to them. Although Brighton's vocabulary is rather limited, he's a great storyteller.

They look forward to getting to know all about the members of Our Redeemer and Peace in the upcoming year.
