#### **OUR REDEEMER PRACTICES CLOSED COMMUNION**

The Sacrament of the Altar is the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine for us Christians to eat and drink, instituted by Christ Himself. As we receive this Sacrament, the oneness of fellowship at the Altar (I Corinthians 10:17) presupposes a oneness in doctrine with the Apostles (Acts 2:42). For this reason the congregations of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod have agreed to follow the Biblical and historical practice of Closed Communion. If you desire to receive the Lord's Supper and are not a communicant member of Our Redeemer or a sister congregation in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, we respectfully ask that you not commune this morning. Rather, we would invite you to speak with Pastor Knox, Pastor Saunders, or Vicar Goodroad about Holy Communion and about becoming a communicant member of this congregation.

**TODAY IS THE 7<sup>th</sup> SUNDAY OF EASTER** The Church year is in another period of transition. This past Thursday the Church observed the Festival of the Ascension of Our Lord. In the weeks to come the Festivals of Pentecost and the Holy Trinity will take place.

As today marks the end of the Easter Season, and the Church prepares for the long Pentecost Season, perhaps the joy and exhilaration of Easter Sunday has worn off. Undoubtedly, the same could have been said for the Early Church. While this certainly did not occur in just a few short weeks, nevertheless, their experiences in the real world caused them to reflect on the significance of Easter and of being a child of God. Yet in the midst of this "real world" Christianity we have the promise of Jesus, who has now ascended to the right hand of the throne of God, that He is praying for His Church. He prayed then and continues to pray now, "Holy Father, keep them in Your name, which you have given me, that they may be one, even as we are one."

Take comfort today, Baptized child of God, that you bear the name of the Holy, Triune God. Take comfort today, Baptized child of God, in the promise of Jesus to pray for you and for His Church. Take further comfort today, Baptized child of God, for the One who prays for you also comes to you in this "real world" and feeds you with His body and blood.



**YOU WILL NOTICE THAT THE PASCHAL CANDLE IS NOT LIT** During the Easter season this candle's light and prominent position near the Altar reminded the Church of the Lord's resurrection and how Christ, who is the Light of the World, has conquered the darkness of sin, death, and the power of the devil. Its visible light also served as a reminder that Christ our Lord showed Himself to His disciples in the 40 days following His resurrection from the dead until the day He ascended to the right hand of the Father. After the Festival of the Ascension this past Thursday the Paschal Candle has been returned to its place by the Baptismal Font where it will be lit at Baptisms and Funerals.






