OUR REDEEMER PRACTICES CLOSED COMMUNION

The Sacrament of the Altar is the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine for us Christians to eat and drink, instituted by Christ Himself. As we receive this Sacrament, the oneness of fellowship at the Altar (I Corinthians 10:17) presupposes a oneness in doctrine with the Apostles (Acts 2:42). For this reason the congregations of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod have agreed to follow the Biblical and historical practice of Closed Communion. If you desire to receive the Lord's Supper and are not a communicant member of Our Redeemer or a sister congregation in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, we respectfully ask that you not commune this morning. Rather, we would invite you to speak with Pastor Knox, Pastor Saunders, or Vicar Goodroad about Holy Communion and about becoming a communicant member of this congregation.

<u>TODAY IS THE 5th SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST</u> Hananiah was a false prophet who was a contemporary of Jeremiah. Very little is known of him except the fact that he was the son of Azzur and Jeremiah condemned him.

False prophets/teachers are deceptive. That's why Jesus and the Apostles of the New Testament warn against them so often! What makes a false prophet/teacher so deceptive? It is that much of what they speak is the truth. The account recorded in today's Old Testament reading is a classic example. Hananiah prophesies that the

Israelites would be set free from the Babylonian captivity and return to their homeland. This was true. The error lies in the fact that Hananiah tells the Israelites that it would happen soon and that it would be done without repentance. **THIS DIRECTLY**

CONTRADICTS WHAT JEREMIAH, THE AUTHENTIC PROPHET OF GOD, HAS SPOKEN!

Life under the king of Babylon was part of God's plan to restore Israel and lead them to faith in His gracious promise. The false prophet softened the judgment of God and led them away from repentance to a false hope and confidence.

This episode in the life of Israel serves as a vivid reminder that God works through those whom He sends.

There are perhaps no greater false prophets than those whose pulpits are the radio waves and the television screens that bring their false messages into your homes. Like Hananiah, they speak a measure of the truth, but they mix it with their lies.

God has given you a shepherd to guide and feed you. You gather in this place to hear the Word of God from the one whom God has placed in this congregation. It is this one, and not another, who Baptizes by Christ's authority in this place and nowhere else. It is this one, and not another, whom Christ has given the authority to forgive and retain sins. It is this one, and not another, through whom Christ speaks, "This is my body . . . this is my blood, given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins." That is why Jesus says in today's Gospel, *"Whoever receives you, receives me, and whoever receives me receives Him who sent me."*



who spoke by the prophets.




