## **OUR REDEEMER PRACTICES CLOSED COMMUNION**

The Sacrament of the Altar is the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine for us Christians to eat and drink, instituted by Christ Himself. As we receive this Sacrament, the oneness of fellowship at the Altar (I Corinthians 10:17) presupposes a oneness in doctrine with the Apostles (Acts 2:42). For this reason the congregations of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod have agreed to follow the Biblical and historical practice of Closed Communion. If you desire to receive the Lord's Supper and are not a communicant member of Our Redeemer or a sister congregation in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, we respectfully ask that you not commune this morning. Rather, we would



invite you to speak with Pastor Knox, Pastor Saunders, or Vicar Baker about Holy Communion and about becoming a communicant member of this congregation.



TODAY IS THE 15<sup>th</sup> SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST "Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbor." This is the 8<sup>th</sup> Commandment. In the Catechism, the simple explanation of these words read, "We should fear and love God that we may not deceitfully belie, betray, slander, nor defame our neighbor, but defend him, speak well of him and put the best construction on everything."

A certain man broke the 8<sup>th</sup> Commandment. He spread rumors about his neighbor. He put the worst construction on what he had heard about his neighbor, only later to find out that the rumor was false. Laden with guilt, the man went to his pastor. He confessed his sin. The pastor, in the stead and by the command of

Christ, forgave him. Going home, the man doubted this forgiveness and so returned to the pastor, still filled with a sense of guilt. The pastor, seeking to assist the man in understanding the nature of God's forgiveness, told the man to fill a bag with feathers, go through the village and place a feather in front of every house where he spoke the rumor. "Do this and come back to see me," the pastor told the man. The man hurried out and did what his pastor asked then returned to the church, seeking the pastor's approval. Much to the man's surprise, the pastor then instructed the man to go back to those houses and gather the feathers. The man looked at the pastor in amazement and said, "by now those feathers are irretrievable, for the wind has surely carried them away." "Precisely," responded the wise pastor, "and so it is with your rumor."

Sin is nasty. Sin is dirty. Sin means death. This is precisely why Jesus dealt with sin in the only way that it could be dealt with by dying. Jesus died a nasty, dirty death so that sin might be forgiven. Jesus has dealt with your sin by putting you to death through your Baptism into His death. This forgiveness is real. Like the wind that carried the feathers away in the little illustration you have just read, so has the blood of Christ carried your sins away.

Do not doubt this dear child of God. Take comfort in the death of Christ; there the payment for your sins was paid. Take comfort in your baptism; there the forgiveness of sins was received. Take comfort in the word of absolution; there the troubled conscience is consoled. Take comfort in Christ's body and blood for, through these, Christ's blood bought forgiveness strengthens you and bestows God's peace.

As one who has been forgiven, Jesus calls you into a life of forgiveness where you must deal with sins against you. This is not easy, but it is not optional either. Jesus says, "If your brother sins against you, go and show him his fault, just between the two of you. If he listens to you, you have won your brother over. But if he will not listen, take one or two others along, so that 'every matter may be established by the testimony of two or three witnesses.' If he refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church; and, if he refuses to listen even to the church, treat him as you would a pagan or a tax collector."

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# **BIBLE STUDY OPPORTUNITIES**

ADULT BIBLE STUDY OF THE BOOK OF REVELATION This morning Pastor Knox will begin a study of the Book of Revelation. It has been more than 20 years since a study of this unique book of the Bible has been offered at Our Redeemer. The study of Revelation will include a study of parts of the book of Daniel from the Old Testament, a book which has similarities with Revelation. Both of these forward looking books of prophecy give the believer confidence as God reveals the glory of His eternal kingdom and the final victory to be enjoyed by all who trust in Christ.

VICAR'S BIBLE RESUMES THIS WEEK The class will meet on Monday, September 11 at 9:00 a.m. at Our Redeemer and on Tuesday, September 12 at 6:00 p.m. at Peace in Shell Rock. There's no denying many of us today have a much different relationship with soil and plants than people typically have had throughout most of history. Some of us get our hands dirty in the garden and enjoy the "fruit of our labors," but gardening is more a hobby than a necessity. On the other hand, farmers' livelihoods do depend on the productivity of their cropland, yet much of their work is done with computers, machinery, and other technology only available within the last 130 years or so. Given the populace's more intimate familiarity with the land during Biblical times, it's not surprising that we can find agricultural descriptions, both literal and figurative, in every section of the Scriptures.

This series doesn't propose to be an exhaustive examination of all these passages. For instance, more attention will be paid to horticulture and botany in general than to animal husbandry. Over the course of 17 sessions, from September to May, we'll discuss texts from Genesis to Revelation, some very familiar and others sometimes overlooked. We'll read selections in which plants play the leading role and discover new insights hidden "in the weeds." The goal is to gain a better understanding of how plant imagery is used in specific contexts as well as being a linking theme throughout the Scriptures.
