The Sacrament of the Altar is the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine for us Christians to eat and drink, instituted by Christ Himself. As we receive this Sacrament, the oneness of fellowship at the Altar (I Corinthians 10:17) presupposes a oneness in doctrine with the Apostles (Acts 2:42). For this reason the congregations of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod have agreed to follow the Biblical and historical practice of Closed Communion. If you desire to receive the Lord's Supper and are not a communicant member of Our Redeemer or a sister congregation in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, we respectfully ask that you not commune this morning. Rather, we would invite you to speak with Pastor Knox,

Pastor Saunders, or Vicar Baker about Holy Communion and about becoming a communicant member of this congregation.

THE REV. JAMES LAMB IS OUR GUEST THIS MORNING Rev. Lamb was the longtime director of Lutherans For Life and now serves as a Life Advocate with Lutheran Family Services. Rev. Lamb will preach during the Divine Service and will teach during Bible Class. He will not only address life issues, he will also provide information about the work which Lutheran Family Services does to help individuals and families in time of need.



TODAY IS THE 17th SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST "That's not fair!" Parents, how many times have you heard that? It's not just children who think things aren't fair. Politicians love to try and divide people by getting them to begrudge what others have or what others don't pay. How many times have you fallen into the trap of saying something's not fair just because you think you are missing out on something? When hearing the Gospel for today, your first reaction might also be, "That's not fair." How could one worker who has worked only a short amount of time get paid the same amount as the worker who worked all day? It is because Jesus is teaching you a very important lesson. He is telling you that God is not fair, and for that you should be very grateful. Instead of fairness, God is gracious and compassionate. If God

were fair, you would get what you deserve—a hopeless life and eternal death. Put into the language of the corporate confession, "I, a poor, miserable sinner, confess unto You all my sins and iniquities with which I have ever offended You and justly deserved Your temporal and eternal punishment."


Yet God the Father, in his mercy, acted unfairly toward Jesus by placing all your sins upon Him. Because God was not fair with Jesus, He will not be fair to you either. Instead, He has given to you what you don't deserve, eternal life and salvation, for the sake of Christ our Lord.

The Hymn of the Day, "Thy Works, Not Mine, O Christ" (LSB #565) is a glorious confession of this truth. It emphasizes the work and the person of Christ, not in addition to, but in place of yours, as the only basis for your salvation. Each of the 5 verses begin with a similar line - Thy works not mine, Thy wounds not mine, Thy cross not mine, Thy death not mine, Thy righteousness not mine. Emptied of all self-righteousness you are led to sing as the conclusion of each verse, "To whom save Thee, Who canst alone for sin atone, Lord, shall I flee?" The answer is clear – to Christ alone!

Baptized into Christ - His works, His wounds, His cross, His death, and His righteousness are yours. Confessing your sin you flee to Him who offers even more with His gracious words, "Your sins are forgiven" and His gracious invitation, "Take, eat, this is my body given for you. Take, drink, this is my blood shed for you for the forgiveness of your sins." It may not be fair, but it is gracious and merciful. Thanks be to God, who like the master in the parable, graciously gives equally to all!






