# **OUR REDEEMER PRACTICES CLOSED COMMUNION**



The Sacrament of the Altar is the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine for us Christians to eat and drink, instituted by Christ Himself. As we receive this Sacrament, the oneness of fellowship at the Altar (I Corinthians 10:17) presupposes a oneness in doctrine with the Apostles (Acts 2:42). For this reason the congregations of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod have agreed to follow the Biblical and historical practice of Closed Communion. If you desire to receive the Lord's Supper and are not a communicant member of Our Redeemer or a sister congregation in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, we respectfully ask that you not commune this morning. Rather, we would invite you to speak with Pastor Knox,

Pastor Saunders, or Vicar Baker about Holy Communion and about becoming a communicant member of this congregation.

**TODAY IS THE SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER**. First Jesus said His followers were like sheep. Then He described them as branches. Today, He calls them friends! But who is He talking to in this way and what do they call themselves? Christian – You may take this name for granted since you are so accustomed to using it when referring to yourself or to the Church. But such was not always the case. Luke, in his second book explains, "The disciples were called Christians first at Antioch." (Acts 11:26)



The name "Christian" was not really a self chosen name nor was it supplied by Jesus. In fact, it was unbelievers, namely the Greeks, who first called the followers of Jesus, Christians. In only two other places

does this term get used in the Bible. In Acts 26:28, the Apostle Paul is on trial before King Agrippa. As Paul so regularly did, he confessed the truth of the Faith to the King. Agrippa responds, "Do you think that in such a short time you can persuade me to be a Christian?" Here Agrippa is using the term Christian to simply mean, "One who follows Christ."


In I Peter 4, the term is used differently. Here St. Peter writes, "Rejoice that you participate in the sufferings of Christ, so that you may be overjoyed when His glory is revealed. If you are insulted because of the name of Christ, you are blessed, for the Spirit of glory and of God rests on you. If you suffer, it should not be as a murderer or thief or any other kind of criminal, or even as a meddler. However, if you suffer as a Christian, do not be ashamed, but praise God that you bear that name."

As a Christian, you are a follower of Christ and you bear His name! Literally, you are <u>in</u> Christ. You are in Christ by virtue of your Baptism into His death and resurrection. You remain in Christ because you feed on His body and drink of His blood. Because of these things, Jesus calls you sheep, branches, and friends, and you call yourself Christian!"

<u>PASCHAL CANDLE</u> A prominent symbol in the celebration of Easter is the Paschal Candle. This Candle, which represents the resurrection of Jesus, was lit at the Easter Vigil. The Candle will be lit throughout the Easter Season and sit at the "Gospel Horn" of the Altar, until the day of the Ascension. It is a visible reminder of the 40 days during which our risen savior showed himself to be alive and triumphant over death and the grave. Throughout the rest of the year, it stands by the Baptismal font.
